### **Horizon Award:**

The Horizon Award is given to an individual that has two – five years' experience as an official and has begun to get his feet under himself as a solid official. Things are starting to click, and the action is slowing down for them. He has been around for a few years and has shown signs of carrying himself as an experienced veteran official.

## Mike O'Neil Memorial Rookie of the Year Award:

Mike O'Neil was a founding member of Lanier Football Officials Association. Originally named: Blueridge Football Officials. He was a member for over forty years and during his time he served as President, Assignor and Secretary. Some years doing all three jobs at the same time. Mike was dedicated to this association and the training of new officials. The Mike O'Neil Rookie of the Year Award was named in his memorial in 2014.

The Rookie of the Year Award is presented to a 1<sup>st</sup> year official, that shows dedication and solid determination of becoming a solid Official. He has shown great potential in the field with good judgment and positive reviews from other officials.

# **Tim Tipton Official of the Year Award:**

Tim Tipton has given decades of time, effort, commitment and dedication to both the art of officiating and the reins of leadership within the Georgia High School Association and the Blue Ridge/Lanier Football Officials Association.
